

## Very Easy Installation Instructions

### What you will get:




A small "A" sample piece of vinyl in an envelope marked "Sample".

Squeegee

Your vinyl letters/graphics will come in separate pieces for each color-you can use our layouts or design your own.

Each decal will have 3 layers including the top layer which is a clear transfer tape, the middle layer which is your vinyl letters/graphics and the bottom layer is a glossy white or blue backing paper.

### What you will need:

Squeegee (included)  Measuring Device  Masking Tape 

Clean location with mild detergent or soap and water — dry thoroughly

### Tips

Use the sample "A" piece of vinyl that you will find in your order to see if the vinyl will stick to your wall or somewhat flat surface with ease. You may need to re-clean your surface or choose a different wall to apply your design to. Highly textured walls are not recommended for vinyl lettering.

Do not touch or handle the back or sticky side of the vinyl lettering/graphics as the oil on your skin will cause the adhesive to be less sticky where you have touched it.

Vinyl likes to be applied at room temperature.

### Step 1

Lay your vinyl lettering/graphics on a flat table and let them *relax*! It is easier to apply flat decals than curled up ones. Use the squeegee and lightly rub the decal until it is smooth and flat. Do not rub too hard as you may cause the vinyl to wrinkle or bubble.

### Step 2

Tape your decal with small pieces of masking tape in each top corner in what ever layout you like. Use a measuring device to make sure your lettering is straight on the wall or surface. Place masking tape along the top edge of the decal securing it to the surface. Rub the tape with the squeegee to insure the tape is sticking to the surface and the decal.

### Step 3

Cut vertically between letters when possible to create a smaller easier piece to work with.

### Step 4

From the bottom of the decal lift up the clear transfer tape, the vinyl should stick to the clear transfer tape and release from the white/blue backing paper.

### Step 5

While holding the clear transfer tape with vinyl up and away from the wall or surface, gently pull

the white/blue backing paper down and out from under the masking tape without pulling the masking tape off of the wall or surface.

#### **Step 6**

Take a hold of the clear transfer tape in the lower 2 corners with your thumbs and index fingers and gently keeping the clear transfer tape taut, lay it down on the wall.

#### **Step 7**

Use your squeegee and at first gently rub the clear transfer tape over your vinyl lettering/graphics starting at the top middle working down and repeat out to each side. Then go back over the vinyl with a little more pressure to insure that all of the vinyl has been rubbed and will stick to the wall or surface.

#### **Step 8**

Starting in the upper right or left corner, peel the clear transfer tape away from the vinyl. The best way is to always peel down and away at an angle keeping the clear transfer tape close to the wall. If the vinyl sticks to the clear transfer tape, lay the piece back down and re-rub over the area that is not sticking. Be careful not to pull to fast as you may rip or wrinkle one of the letters.

#### **Step 9**

Once the clear tape is completely removed from your vinyl letters/graphics use a soft cloth to go over each letter or piece of vinyl with a fair amount of pressure to insure the adhesive is contacting the wall or surface. If you discover a bubble use a pin to pop a hole in the bubble and gently push the air towards the pin hole with your finger.

#### **Step 10**

Sit back and enjoy your design. Invite your friends over to see it, and let them know where they can buy their own customized lettering and graphics, and how easy it is to install it yourself. #### **Removal**

There may come a day where you have to remove your vinyl to paint or change the design. All you have to do is using a tweezers start to lift the vinyl from the wall and pull it off. If need be, you can apply some heat with a blow dryer which will soften the adhesive and help with easy removal.
